Pupil Premium

The government is giving money to schools to help children from lower income families do their very best. This funding is called a 'Pupil Premium'. For every child registered, William Barnes Primary School gets £1320 per year and with this money we could help target pupils' specific needs and support them better in their learning. If you are registered for Free School Meals you will also qualify for a free school jumper in KS1 and KS2 and may be able to access help with costs of residential visits. Please speak to the office staff if you think you may be able to apply. The process takes a very short time and will be treated with the utmost confidentiality.
