- Caring nurturing teaching assistant support and care
 - Class charters
 - Code of conduct
 - Playtime Buddies

- Assessment for learning ethos
 - Social stories
 - Relaxation
- Mindfulness based PSHE curriculum
 - Occupational therapy sessions
- SENDCO and SEN support
 - Firm but fair behaviour management
- 3 warnings behaviour system
- Rewards systems for good learning behaviour
 - Nurture groups
 - Emotional literacy and support assistants (ELSA support)
