Dear Parents and Carers

January seems to have flown past yet again. Thank you so much for all your support and understanding with our recent covid cases. It is so important that we keep our school open for all as much as we can. We will continue to ask all parents to wear masks on the premises and when coming into school due to the number of cases. Key Stage 2 will remain in bubbles at the present until the numbers drop.

Please continue to follow the guidance we have sent out if you have a positive LFT. If your child is positive but are feeling well in themselves and would like to join the class learning on-line then please can you email their class teacher on their Year group email.

Weather

The weather remains cold and wet so please ensure your child has a coat every day. Also please listen out on local media and check h p://mapping.dorsetforyou.com/ closed services for any possible school closure. We will text all parents before 8.00 a.m. if school is closed. To this end, please ensure that there are current telephone numbers held in the school office so that you can be contacted either if school is closed early in the morning or if we need to close school earlier than 3.15 p.m.

On icy mornings the car park and driveway can become very slippery so please do take care. We will put grit down as much as possible. Please can adults ensure the children do not slide on the ice.

Surveys

Following our recent travel survey I have updated the Travel Plan which will go to the Governors in March. Many of you continue to be concerned about the narrow pavements and I would urge you to contact the Local Council with your concerns. There was overwhelming support for our barrier. As you are aware the barrier is now in place and this has ensured the safety of our children.

Following our recent accessibility survey for parents of children with SEN, I will be updating our accessibility plan and will discuss with governors in March. This will then be posted on our website.



Rising 5s

Following the GDPR act we cannot contact prospective parents for September 2022 before a place is accepted at our school in April. We would still like Rising 5s to commence in the summer term. The children who are starting with us in September 2022 are invited to come into our Reception class for an hour, 1.10 - 2.10 p.m. every Tuesday afternoon, covid restrictions permitting. Just a reminder that our Behaviour policy is published on our website. We have updated the policy with our attachment training. Mr Newman and I have attended training called Dorset STEPs and we will be further training staff and updating the policy. Also a reminder that I am the e-safety champion, anti-bullying lead and Designated Safeguarding Lead in the school. Mr Richard Hull is the Deputy Safeguarding Lead.

We have a critical incident policy where if we need to leave the school building we will go to the Exchange. Part of our critical incident policy is, if necessary, to congregate in the school. We hold a practice as well as our usual fire practice.
