This term, we are continuing our learning journey with a mini topic all about Winter followed by the main topic which is 'People Who Help Us'. This Learning organiser is aimed to help support your child and ask them questions about their learning in school. If you would like to continue the learning journey at home, please see some ideas below and upload any ideas to Tapestry or bring in work completed at home to share with the class.

Key Questions

Who helps you at home and at school?

Have you ever helped anyone else? How did you help?

Can you describe someone who has helped you?

Who helps to keep you safe and healthy?

Who helps us when we are ill?

Who helps us to look after our teeth?

What does a Police Officer do to keep us safe?

Can you describe what a firefighter does to help others?

What equipment does a doctor need to use?

What are the emergency services?

How can you get help from the emergency services?

Home Learning Challenges

Talk about different job roles people have in the community and how they can help us?

Talk to your child about friends and family who may have jobs that help others (see list opposite).

When out and about see if you can spot any of the job roles listed on the poster opposite.

Create a picture or drawing of a police office, firefighter or doctor?

Role play with your child the different jobs - take turns to be the person helping (e.g. Doctor) and the person being helped (an ill person).
