Dear Parents and Carers

As the seasonal weather can be wet and windy with some very unpredictable weather, please make sure your child has a coat every day, even if it seems sunny in the morning. As a reminder, please name all items of clothing - it is then very easy to return a lost item of clothing to a child.

Also, children do need a pair of sensible school shoes which are waterproof, as well as trainers. Our site means that every class has to move around outside between classes and the hall, so it is important for children to have the right kit at the right time.

We are very aware that the cost of living crisis affects everyone. We will try to keep costs to a minimum. If you need help or someone to talk to please do arrange to come and talk with myself. I can also arrange support from a family worker.

Remembrance Service

PGL and Leeson House

Year 5 parents should have received a letter regarding Leeson House and PGL visits. The deposit for PGL was due in October and the deposit for Leeson House is due in November. We really need parents to keep to the payment plan to spread the costs for yourselves and also so we are not chasing late payments prior to your trip.

September 2024 intake

I hope you were able to attend our open evening and/or day on 11^{th} October, if you were unable to visit and you would like to be shown around please contact the school office and we will arrange a visit.

We will be running our Rising Fives in the Summer term, due to GDPR (general data) regulations we will not be able to email prospective parents until their school place is confirmed. Once the place is confirmed we will send out information to all parents.

Pupil Premium

The government supports schools to help children from lower income families do their very best. This funding is called a 'Pupil Premium'. For every child registered, William Barnes Primary School receives £1300 per year to help target pupils' specific needs and provide additional support for learning. If you are registered for Free School Meals, you will also qualify for a free school jumper in KS1 and KS2 and may be able to access help with costs of residential visits. Please speak to the office staff if you think you may be able to apply. The process takes a very short time and will be treated with the utmost confidentiality.

Adult Literacy Support

If you know anyone who would like support with reading; then ReadEasy may be of interest. ReadEasy teaches reading to adults who are struggling with their reading skills and would like to learn. The sessions are one-to-one, confidential and free. Many non-readers are unaware that help is available and don't know how to access services, if you would like to find out more please message ReadEasy (07510 250365).
