
Year Six 2023-2024 at ...

PE Kit and School Uniform.

Classroom Support

This year, our class are very lucky to have the support of Mrs Chant and Mrs Toone, who they all know very well! She will be supporting the class and groups as well as running a variety of intervention programmes. When they swap for mathematics with Mr Hull, they will supported by Miss Bates.

HTSW

We will be continuing our HomeTalkSchoolWrite project this year; please talk with your child during these weeks so that they are prepared for the Friday's writing activity. We send home a copy of their work which is not marked. We mark the original piece of work at a later date.

SATS

At the end of this year, SATs will take place. Children will take SATs in Mathematics, Spelling, Grammar and Reading. Nearer the time, there will be meetings for you to have a look at some of the tests, talk about them and ask any questions. We encourage the children, in the meantime, not to worry about them as they will be well prepared by the time they arrive.

Reading Journal/ Homework/Reading

As part of homework, students will be expected to read at home at 5 times a week. All students will choose books from their place in the scheme or from our selection of free readers in the classroom. If your child does not have a reading book bag, please buy them one as this ensures the safety of books/journal in transit. There will also be mathematics homework from Mr. Hull and other homework from me.

As mentioned above, every year, an amazing variety of books are seen in our classroom as a result of year 6's buying their own reading material. If children choose to read their own book, please can you make sure it comes to school every day for their independent reading as I would prefer them not to be reading their two books at the same time. We would very much appreciate any donations of books they will not read again to add to the choices we have in school – children are allowed to add a dedication in the front of the book so that everyone knows who donated it!

Lateness, Homework/Reading Book/Journal forgotten

Children can come on to the playground from 8.30 and should definitely be here by 8.45. We will be monitoring pupils who forget any of the above. I will be using the text service to inform you if this has happened and particularly if it is happening on a regular basis. It is very disruptive to the school day and embarrassing for the child to arrive in an already focussed classroom or without required resources for the day.

Trips

PGL is next week and the usual London Gallery Trip will run in the Summer Term. All children are expected to attend all trips so please let me know early if there are issues.

PPA Time

As you know, all teachers have non-contact time each week for planning, preparation and assessments. Mrs Wrixon will be teaching Year 6 students on a Thursday morning and will cover Religious Education, Music and French. Mr Hull will teach them Mathematics every day and ICT on a Monday afternoon.
